Information about PechaKucha

The annual ANTF symposium includes the opportunity for NTFs to introduce themselves and to discuss their work. We use a PechaKucha approach to enable lively, fun and concise presentations.

As PechaKucha™ explain:

“It’s a format that makes presentations concise, and keeps things moving at a rapid pace.”

PechaKucha is a simple presentation format where you show a limited number of images for a very short time. The images advance automatically and you talk along to the images. The presentation format was devised by Astrid Klein and Mark Dytham of Klein Dytham architecture. The first PechaKucha Night was held in Tokyo in their gallery/lounge/bar/club/creative kitchen, SuperDeluxe, in February, 2003.”
